It's less than 70 days away! The total solar eclipse's path of totality will cross Southern Illinois for the second time in less than seven years. The Kaskaskia Regional Port District (KRPD) operates multiple terminals on both the Kaskaskia and Mississippi Rivers. In addition to the waterways, KRPD has existing infrastructure with access to two Class I (CN and UP) railroads and a road network that supports shipping and receiving. KRPD is aggressive in supporting local companies, ensuring they have the resources necessary to expand and grow. #### **Education & Workforce Development**

Have you heard? Vienna has a new cafe in town, and it is much more than your typical cafe! Arrowleaf cut the ribbon on <u>Clyffe Cafe</u> last month and fully opened its doors on January 29th. The cafe is part of a Supported Employment (SE) program, an approach to vocational rehabilitation for people with serious mental illnesses and individuals with disabilities. It emphasizes helping them obtain competitive work in the community and providing the support necessary to ensure their success in the workplace. SE programs help consumers find jobs that pay competitive wages in integrated settings in the community, often with other people who don't necessarily have disabilities. Clyffe Cafe is a nearly 2000 square foot full-service restaurant. Arrowleaf will continue to use an additional 2000 square feet for classrooms, community day services, office space, and supported employment programming. Morgan Banks, the site coordinator for Clyffe Cafe, has over 10 years of experience providing direct support services with Arrowleaf along with more than 10 years in restaurant management.
