SOUTHERN ILLLINOIS UNIVERSITY CARBONDALE AND AISIN ILLINOIS JOIN FORCES FOR NEW TALENT DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIP



Southern Illinois University (SIU) Carbondale has developed a partnership with Marion's AISIN Electronics Illinois, LLC (AEIL) that allows AISIN employees to earn a degree in a variety of industrial management and engineering fields of study.

During a recruiting event in November, the first 14 AISIN employees signed up for the program being offered through SIU Carbondale's School of Applied Engineering and Technology in the College of Engineering, Technology and Mathematics.



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The coordination between the organizations will allow AISIN to skill up our workforce, while also providing a career roadmap for our members. This is a true win-win partnership, and it's something we look to extend to our other facilities.

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Under the new program, AISIN will pay participants to work five days a week while also covering tuition, books, fees, transportation and parking. The students will work part-time in their specific engineering area at AISIN's plant in Marion, Illinois, while also attending school and maintaining good academic standing. AISIN also asks that participants commit to working for the company for at least two years following their graduations.

Since its inception, SI Now has worked with economic developers throughout Southern Illinois at the local level to identify sites, which is our product to offer to potential businesses. The SI Ready: Top 20 Project is a big step in taking these sites to the next level to compete

on a national level for projects. Working with Global Location Strategies (GLS) and Schneider Strategy Consulting, we can identify potential limitations for each site and strategize with the community on how to address them. I'm excited to see the end results, which will be out in later January, providing a comprehensive report for five of the top sites, including detailed recommendations to enhance the site's competitiveness. The ultimate goal is to position each site to attract new businesses and contribute to regional economic growth.

2024 was a **big year** for Southern Illinois, but 2025 is promising to be even bigger, pushing Southern Illinois forward and continuing the area's historic momentum.

In December 2024, SI Now met with Southern Illinois' Regional Offices of Education to discuss areas in which SI Now and the <u>Southern Illinois Region's Leadership Community</u> might help fill employer engagement gaps in collaboration with workforce partners, industry leaders, and local educators. As a result, plans are underway for the development of a regional industry engagement calendar and scheduling tool for the 2025-2026 school year to streamline and simplify industry engagement opportunities for area high schools.
